



The V⁷ Chord


(pronounced "five-seven")



 ${f V}$ is the Roman numeral for the number ${f 5}$.

The V⁷ chord is formed by playing both the dominant note and the note below it in the 5-finger scale.





Mr. Haydn's Chords

- 1. Write I or V7 under each measure.
 - Play the chords as your teacher plays the London Symphony Theme high on the piano. (Lesson Book p. 52)




2. Write I or V⁷ in each of Mr. Haydn's wigs. Now play the chord pattern you wrote.




Fun Facts for Mr. Haydn

- Read the words, then play each melody.
- 2. Now write I or V^7 in each box to harmonize the melody.
 - If the R.H. plays mostly scale steps 1-3-5, use the I chord.
 - If the R.H. plays mostly scale steps 2-4-5, use the V⁷ chord.
- Play each melody with the chords.
